II. PRESENTATIONS

- **3.** Presentation: Overview of the Proposed Affordable Housing, Homelessness Solutions and Prevention Now Transactions and Use Tax Ballot Initiative.
 - Thomas Faughnan, Senior Assistant County Counsel, and Shirley R. Edwards, Deputy County Counsel, County of Los Angeles, Office of the County Counsel (24-0639)

Vice Chair Rex Richardson presented the item and reported that at the previous LACAHSA meeting held on December 14, 2023, the Our Future Los Angeles County Coalition shared their Citizens' Initiative Ballot Measure (Measure). Following a robust discussion at the December 14, 2023 meeting, it was noted that further discussion on the Measure was needed. For that reason, representatives from the Los Angeles County Office of the County Counsel were called upon to present on the Measure's potential implications and benefits to the LACAHSA Board.

Shirley R. Edwards, Deputy County Counsel, County of Los Angeles Office of County Counsel, made a presentation and responded to the questions posed by the LACAHSA Board. Mr. Thomas Faughnan, Senior Assistant County Counsel, County of Los Angeles Office of the County Counsel was also present and available to respond to questions by the LACAHSA Board.

Vice Chair Rex Richardson complimented the presenters and thanked them for clarifying issues raised about the Measure, including the requirements built into the Measure. Vice Chair Rex Richardson also commented that he appreciated that the presentation was focused on the production and the delivery results, built into the Measure.

Opportunity was given to Members of the Public to address the LACAHSA Board. There was no public comment on this item.

4. Presentation by LeSar Holdings Inc. (LeSar) on LeSar's Scope of Work as LACAHSA's Policy Consultant. (24-0640)

Vice Chair Rex Richardson presented the item and added that at the December 14, 2023 LACAHSA meeting, the LACAHSA Board approved LeSar Holdings (LeSar) to serve as LACAHSA's policy consultant. To date, the contract with LeSar has been fully executed and LACAHSA has officially begun its engagement with LeSar.

Today's presentation by LeSar will focus on LeSar's scope of work as LACAHSA's policy consultant. The LeSar Team comes with significant expertise in housing and community development and will be a real asset to the LACAHSA Board as decisions are made. Vice Chair Rex Richardson introduced Natalie Donlin-Zappella, Director of Partnerships & Climate Practice at LeSar.

Ms. Donlin-Zappella greeted and introduced herself to the LACAHSA Board. She expressed enthusiasm and appreciation for being able to represent LeSar during this meeting. Ms. Donlin-Zappella explained that the LeSar Team is comprised of LeSar Holdings along with two LeSar affiliates, LeSar Development Consultants and Global Policy Leadership Academy. In addition, two partners on the LACAHSA Project will include Sandra McNeill Consulting and CTY Housing, Inc.

Ms. Donlin-Zappella introduced the LeSar Project Team and affiliate partners and briefly shared their professional experience and roles each team member and affiliate partners will have on the LACAHSA Project.

Ms. Donlin-Zappella explained that LeSar's scope of services as the policy consultant for LACAHSA over the next 11 months will be dedicated to supporting LACAHSA's startup phase which includes LACAHSA formation needs, ongoing agency project management, and the LACAHSA's learnings, operations and innovation.

For LACAHSA's formational needs, LeSar will engage with the LACAHSA Board to develop a written project plan with sample scenarios and recommendations on how LACAHSA can be governed, operated and provide program support. The written project plan is expected to be completed and presented at a future LACAHSA meeting in late Spring or early Summer.

In terms of the ongoing agency project management, LeSar will provide weekly ongoing support for both the LACAHSA Board, LACAHSA's CEO, and all LACAHSA Ad-Hoc Committees. The ongoing support will be between 12 and 15 hours weekly. This support will include dedicated support to LACAHSA's Executive Leadership, monthly meeting preparation, agenda building support, meeting follow-up, implementation and regular coordination with the LACAHSA Project Manager.

For the Governing Board's learnings, operations and innovations, LeSar will develop a written plan and will research opportunities for LACAHSA. By June 2024, LeSar anticipates having a project plan and/or RFP developed for board development and trainings. LeSar will also provide quarterly presentations on grant and funding opportunities for LACAHSA's agency needs and goals. These presentations are anticipated to be available by March, June, September and December of 2024.

Ms. Natalie Donlin-Zappella responded to questions posed by the LACAHSA Board.

Discussion and acceptance of a report from the Budget and Administrative Executive Ad-Hoc Committee regarding the need to secure 24-month bridge funding in an amount not to exceed \$10 Million to support program development (including staff funding) and critically build LACAHSA's capacity to develop and deliver services, and take appropriate action as follows:
 - a. Find the proposed actions are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act for the following reasons: The proposed actions are not projects pursuant to California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) because these are activities that are excluded from the definition of a project by Section 15378 of the CEQA Guidelines. The proposed actions are administrative activities of LACAHSA (a local governmental agency), which will not result in direct or indirect changes to the environment.
 - b. Approve, authorize and delegate authority to the LACAHSA Chair or designee, with consultation support from the Budget and Administrative Executive Ad-Hoc Committee, to take appropriate action to identify funding opportunities through federal legislative efforts in an amount not to exceed \$10 Million as more fully described in the attached Report from the Budget and Administrative Executive Ad-Hoc Committee, including but not limited to the following actions:
 - i. Draft, collect signatures for, and send multi-signature letters to Federal legislators who represent cities and unincorporated areas in Los Angeles County advocating for federal legislation to secure 24-month bridge funding in an amount not to exceed \$10 Million to support program development (including staff funding) and critically build LACAHSA's capacity to develop and deliver services.
 - ii. Request assistance from the County of Los Angeles to provide assistance with federal legislative advocacy for 24-month bridge funding of \$10 Million as described above.
 - c. As authorized in the March 17, 2023 MOU by and among LACAHSA, United Way, Inc. and the County of Los Angeles, and pursuant to Section 64720(h) of the Government Code, approve, authorize and delegate authority to the County of Los Angeles to review and assist with document drafting and related support of LACAHSA efforts to identify and/or seek funding opportunities as herein set out above.
 - d. No later than 90 calendar days from the date this Agenda Item is approved by the Board, the LACAHSA Chair or designee shall report back to the Board in open session the status of these efforts as set out herein above. (24-0660)

Vice Chair Rex Richardson presented the item and reported that at a recent meeting of the LACAHSA Budget and Administrative Executive Ad-Hoc Committee (Executive Ad-Hoc Committee), the concept of pursuing federal funding opportunities alongside LACAHSA's pursuit of state funding opportunities was discussed. He further added that the Executive Ad-Hoc Committee agreed that LACAHSA should also request federal funding. Through the federal funding request, LACAHSA looks forward to engaging with Los Angeles County as well as with the Los Angeles County Delegation of Federal Representatives to explore the feasibility of Federal approval for \$10 million.

- 6. Discussion and acceptance of the report from the LACAHSA Chair on the need to support the preservation of funding for the Regional Early Action Planning Grants 2.0 program (REAP 2.0) currently proposed to be cut in the amount of \$300 Million in the January 10, 2024 Summary of the State 2024-2025 Budget:
 - a. Approve, authorize and delegate authority to the LACAHSA Chair or designee to draft, sign, collect signatures for and send multi-signature letters to State legislators and the Governor's office to advocate against any state budget funding cuts to REAP 2.0. (24-0658)

Vice Chair Rex Richardson indicated that this item is to request the Board's approval to delegate authority to the LACAHSA Chair to draft and sign advocacy letters for the preservation of the REAP 2.0 funding. He further explained that the LACAHSA Chair will take the lead on advocating to preserve funding for REAP 2.0 that will in turn assist the LACAHSA Board to build the capacity needed to be an effective agency and make a difference in housing.

Vice Chair Richardson announced that Board Member Kome Ajise will leave the Board Room and recuse himself from participating on this item due to his receipt of income from Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG).

Alternate Board Member Isela Gracian (for Chair Holly J. Mitchell) added that the REAP 2.0 funding helps multiple jurisdictions and supports many of the cities in Los Angeles County in addition to the assistance it would provide to the LACAHSA Board.
